CLINTON GLENN MCMARTIN

“Clinton Glenn McMartin Scholarship Fund”

Clinton Glenn McMartin, the son of Deegene W. and Linda D. Kuhlman McMartin, was born July 25, 1974, in Marshelltown, Iowa. Clinton grew up on a farm eight miles West of Grundy Center, Iowa. In 1993, he graduated from Wellsburg-SteamboatRock Community School. Clinton later received a bachelors degree in elementary education at Northwestern College in Orange City, and a master's degree in elementary administration from Iowa State University.

Clinton married Caryn Ann Rose on June 21, 1997, at Wellsburg Reformed Church. Clinton and Caryn had three children-Madison (November 5, 2001), Trevor (January 24, 2003), and Gabriel (December 24, 2007). Clinton and his family lived West of Grundy Center, Iowa, on the same farm he grew up.

Thirteen years Clinton taught at the elementary level, including eleven years at Grundy Center Community School District, fourth and second grades, and began teaching kindergarten. He was the head high school boys track coach at Grundy Center, held football coaching positions at the junior high and high

school levels and coached junior high girls basketball, as well as officiating. While coaching, his high school boys' track teams won NICL Conference titles, and Mr. McMartin was recognized as the NICL Conference coach of the year.

Clinton was a member of First Presbyterian Church of Steamboat Rock where he served as trustee and taught Sunday school and vacation Bible school. He also volunteered part of his time with the 4-H club.

The Clinton Glenn McMartin Scholarship Fund was created in memory of Clinton McMartin's life, and to keep his legacy as a teacher, coach, husband, father, and man of God alive. The Clinton Glenn McMartin Scholarship Fund also wants to

financially support young individuals to achieve their career goals of becoming a teacher or coach.

Clinton Glenn McMartin tragically passed away Friday, August 27, 2010, from Leukemia. Clinton was thirty-six years old, but left a vibrant legacy that will keep on shining for generations to come.
